

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

THE MAISON CARRÉE WORLD HERITAGE LIST CANDIDATE


Each year, France chooses a cultural, natural or mixed feature for submission to UNESCO and entry on the prestigious World Heritage List. In return, the sites entered undertake to do everything to restore, protect, show off and pass on to future generations this heritage that they are in charge of and must share with the entire world.

The Maison Carrée is a candidate for entry on the World Heritage I is t by virtue of criterion (IV): to be an outstanding example of a type of building, architectural or technological ensemble or landscape which illustrates (a) significant stage(s) in human history.

Indeed, built during Augustus' lifetime, the Maison Carrée in Nîmes is an exceptional example of Roman religious, civil and political architecture. It is one of the oldest and best-conserved examples of a Roman temple devoted to the imperial cult. The monument, whose decor is intact, is of remarkable architectural quality.

The historical circumstances of its creation, its political importance and the options of style governing its construction show lasting peace, agreement and prosperity that supported and sought to guarantee the Roman Empire during the First Century AD.

France is to present La Maison Carrée de Nîmes to the international World List Heritage during its 46th session in 2023.



MAISON CARRÉE



Built in the 1st century AD and dedicated to Caius and Lucius Caesar, the grandsons of the Emperor Augustus, the Maison Carrée is one of the best-conserved temples of the Roman world. It impresses by the harmonious proportions, elegant columns with Corinthian capitals and the finesse of the architectural decor.

The first Roman temple dedicated to imperial worship, this prestigious building is now a candidate for inclusion on the UNESCO World Heritage List.





ARÈNES (XXX

Considered as being the best-conserved amphitheater of the Roman world, the Arena was built at the end of the 1st century AD, shortly after the Coliseum in Rome. It had a capacity for more than 24,000 spectators who watched hunts and animal and gladiator fights.

The amphitheater is now used for bullfights, congresses, concerts and sports events.

NÎMES, **monuments**



JARDINS DE LA FONTAINE

The first inhabitants of Nîmes settled in the 6th century BC near the sacred spring. In the 1st century BC the Romans set it in the Augusteum, a vast sanctuary dedicated to the god Nemausus and the emperor Augustus. This monumental set of buildings was rediscovered in the 18th century and the architects Jacques-Philippe Mareschal and Pierre Dardailhon designed a magnificent formal garden that respected the layout of the archaeological remains. The upper part of the garden was developed in the early 19th century with Italian and English touches in the style of the time.

Coat of arms




In 31 BC, Octavian defeated the fleet of Mark Antony and Cleopatra at Actium and established peace in the Roman world. Octavian could then establish the empire and took the name of Augustus.

A coin was struck in Nîmes to celebrate the event. On the reverse side was a crocodile chained to a palm tree surmounted by a laurel wreath, symbolizing the conquest of Egypt.

In 1535 they were authorized by King François 1 to adopt the palm tree and the crocodile as the town's coat of arms. Since then the inhabitants have been extremely proud of their crest.

Redesigned in 1986 by Philippe Starck, the coin can be found all over the town, even in the bronze studs set in the paving of the old town (on sale at the Tourist Office shop).



TOUR MAGNE

The 'Big Tower' stands above the Roman sanctuary and was part of the Augustan walls that ran for more than 6 kilometres. It was 36 metres high and was built around and over a previous Celtic tower that was 18 metres high and disappeared in the 17th century. It is now reduced to 32.50 metres high. The view from the top is remarkable, running from Mont Ventoux to the Pic St Loup.



TEMPLE DE DIANE

In the 1st century BC, this building was part of the *Augusteum* with the sacred spring, an immense portico, a small theater and a nymphaeum. Although its purpose is not clear and the origin of its name unknown, the rich ornamentation inside is well conserved. The romantic nature of the ruins has inspired many artists, such as the famous painter Hubert Robert.



CASTELLUM AQUAE

This vestige, as well as the one in Pompeii, is an extremely rare one of the Roman world. The *Castellum* is the point of arrival of the aqueduct running to Nîmes and along which the Pont du Gard is the main structure. From this circular reception basin, lead pipes carried the water to the thermal baths, the public fountains and the various districts of the city.



PORTE AUGUSTE AND PORTE DE FRANCE

The sanctuary of the imperial cult, Porte Auguste (or Porte d'Arles) was one of the main gates of the ancient town. Coming from Beaucaire, the Via Domitia crossed the town via this gate to continue towards Spain.

Dating back to the 1st century BC, the Porte de France is, together with Porte Auguste, one of the only two gates in the Augustan walls that can still be seen.



The origins of Denim cloth

Nîmes was famous for textile manufacturing in the seventeenth century. Merchants mainly traded woollen cloth and silk. The range of textile manufactured broadened little by little. Cotton was imported and then indigo, a dye plant grown in Italy that was an economical source of a fine blue colour. Serge de Nîmes, a resistant fabric thanks to its oblique weaving with unbleached and indigo-dyed threads, was created. It differs from other serges by its progressive washing and its blue and white shades. At this time, commercial counters are established all around the world

The characteristics of this Serge de Nîmes, exported to the United States via the ports of Genoa and Manchester, are very similar to those of denim, a fabric used by Levi Stauss in the 19th century to make his famous jeans, sturdy and cheap trousers for American gold seekers. If this garment has now conquered all continents and has become a symbol of freedom, it is possible that its origins are Nîmoises.



CATHÉDRALE NOTRE-DAME-ET-SAINT-CASTOR

Consecrated in 1096, the cathedral of Notre-Dame-and-Saint-Castor has been modified on many occasions over the centuries. The upper frieze is considered to be a major example of Romanesque sculpture in the South of France. The motifs of the pediment and the cornice - acanthus leaves and lions heads - were inspired by the Maison Carrée.

MUSÉE DES CULTURES TAURINES HENRIETTE ET CLAUDE VIALLAT

Just a stone's throw from the Amphitheater, the "Musée des Cultures Taurines" is a unique institution in France. Opened in 2002 on the occasion of the celebration of the fiftieth anniversary of the Feria de Nîmes, its offers the public a chance to discover a culture that is still active, a rich and varied heritage. Here, works of Art and everyday objects bring to mind both regional and international traditions. Many temporary exhibitions feature great artists such as Picasso and Goya.

MUSÉE D'ART CONTEMPORAIN CARRÉ D'ART 🐯

16 place de la Maison Carrée

The collection of the "Musée d'art contemporain", a building designed by Norman Foster, consists of almost 600 works from the 1960s until today. French art movements, including 'Supports-Surfaces' in particular, and important foreign artists are represented. The museum holds two temporary exhibitions of international stature every year and also shows specific projects in a Project Room.

MUSÉE DE LA ROMANITÉ 🕮

6 boulevard des Arène

Contemporary building designed by Elizabeth de Portzamparc, this new museum with international reputation is a splendid showcase for 5,000 heritage works. An innovative museum, an archaeological garden and a living space, the building has a triple ambition: preserve heritage, share it with visitors and pass this unique heritage on to future generations. The museum also hosts temporary exhibitions.



MUSÉE DES BEAUX-ARTS

With its interior redesigned by the architect Jean-Michel Wilmotte in 1987, The "Musée des Beaux-Arts" presents a rich collection of more than 3600 works characteristic of the French, Flemish, Dutch and Italian schools of painting from the 16th to the 19th centuries.

An impressive Roman mosaic, "The Wedding of Admetus", occupies the central part of the atrium. It was discovered in the 19th century on the site of the covered market (les Halles).



MUSÉE DU VIEUX NIMES

Housed in the former bishop's palace built in the late 17th century, the "Musée du Vieux Nîmes" possesses collections illustrating life in Nîmes since the end of the Middle Ages. Exhibits range from the everyday to the extraordinary, cloth manufactured by the Nîmes textile industry are presented and a room is devoted to 'serge de Nîmes' and jeans. Visitors of the temporary exhibitions and the permanent collection can enjoy a trip back in time.



MUSEUM - MUSÉE D'HISTOIRE NATURELLE

Created in 1895, the Museum has collections in the fields of natural sciences and human sciences. Themes such as prehistory, ethnography of the 1930s and zoology are presented.

. The ethnography room has a presentation that has remained deliberately unchanged since the 1930s and reveals the dominant ideas of the colonial era.

ABBATIALE DE **SAINT-GILLES**



Built at the end of the 12th century, the abbey church is a real architectural jewel. In the past, this major site attracted pilgrims from all over the world. Today, the monument is listed as a World Heritage Site as part of the "Pilgrimage Route to Santiago de Compostela in France" series.

Take the time to admire its sculpted façade, an authentic masterpiece of Romanesque art. Among others, you will find a frieze with an iconography dedicated to the Passion of Christ.

Discover its monumental crypt, a full-sized lower church. Exceptional in its size and the quality of its vaults, it still contains the tomb of Saint Gilles.

TERROIR DES COSTIÈRES

A kingdom of rolled pebbles deposited by the Rhône and the Durance, the Costières terroir will surprise you with the diversity of its landscapes! Underfoot you'll see a mosaic of different types of soil: white limestone, reddish pebbles, yellow sand or red clay, you'll be amazed by the many different colours! Now look up and contemplate the vineyards and orchards that reign supreme on the Costières



PONT DU GARD, L'AQUEDUC DE NIMES 🕮





Built in the 1st century AD, the Pont du Gard is without a doubt the most spectacular structure of the aqueduct and has been on the Unesco World Heritage List since 1985. The Romans built a bridge of exceptional dimensions to cross the Gardon valley: 275 metres long, 48 metres high (the highest of the Roman world) and three superposed tiers of arches.



12h30-14h00 Lunch in the city centre.

Afternoon

Independent visit of the permanent collections that trace 2500 years of Roman history at the **Musée de la Romanité.**

Open since 2018 and designed by Elizabeth de Portzamparc, this archeological museum is draped in a translucent undulating glass façade that is a reminder of ancient mosaic.







A trip with a commentary lasting about 45 minutes forming an excellent introduction to the city before leaving for a more detailed exploration of the riches of our heritage.

Continue your visit with the *castellum divisorium*, the distribution tank for the water coming from Uzès by way of the famous Pont du Gard. It is a particularly rare feature in the Roman world. Then cross the former **dyers' district** and learn more about the textile industry in Nîmes—flourishing in the 17th and 18th centuries. Listen to the fantastic story of serge de Nîmes and its links with the name used by Levi Strauss to make the first jeans.

Departure by coach for the **Pont du Gard**, the most impressive feature of the Roman aqueduct that supplied Nîmes. Rising to 49 m, it is the tallest aqueduct in the Roman world! On the UNESCO Word Heritage List since 1985, the site includes a museum and a visitors' path called 'Mémoires de Garrigues'.



Departure for Saint-Gilles. See an olive grove with more than 10,000 specimens under ecological farming.

day will take you to the very heart of the Mediterranean identity of Nîmes.

The climate and soil of a region form a biotope that is a condition for the adaptation of the vegetation. Each olive growing area has a dominant variety, where it gives its best. Picholine thus chose its territory in the Nîmes area.

Nîmes olive oil has had a Protected Designation of Origin (PDO) since 2004 and Olive de Nîmes had had this since 2006.

Your trip to olive country must include a tasting!

Lunch nearby.

Afternoon

Visit to a vineyard farm whose 'Costières de Nîmes' has held an AOC since 1986. It is the southernmost of the Rhone Valley and fine 'Syrah, 'Grenache, Cinsault and Mourvèdre etc. are grown there.





Morning

Departure by coach for **Saint-Gilles**, at the gates of the Camargue.

Visit the abbey church in the heart of the village. Built at the end of the 12th century, the abbey is a magnificent piece of southern French Romanesque, boasting a richly decorated façade.

Thanks to our visit with a commentary, visit the crypt that houses the remains of the former hermit and, thanks to our commentary, have an exlusive view of the famous vis staircase of Saint-Gilles! Previously much frequented by pilgrims from all over the world, the monument is now listed on the World Heritage List as part of the series Routes of Santiago de Compostela in France.

Departure for **Aigues-Mortes**, a fortified town built by Louis IX who wanted the Kingdom of France to have a port on the Mediterranean.

Lunch in the fortified town

Afternoon

Visit to the **Tour de Constance**, built by Louis IX in 1242 and classified as a historical monument in 1903. The upper terrace is topped by a watchtower that was used as a lighthouse from the 13th to the 16th century. It then served as a prison especially for Protestants, and is now is a key marker of the struggle for the freedom of thought.

They day ends with a visit of the **Salin d'Aigues-Mortes** on a small tourist train.



A singular feature of the site is that ducks handle the weeding and so no pesticides are used.

Day 1: Nîmes

Morning

Discovery of Nîmes starting with Les Halles, the Central Market. A true centre of life and the gastronomic heart of the city, and where more than 12 AOP products can be found on the stalls. From brandade de Nîmes to Picholine olives, from tapenade to the petit pâté nîmois, without forgetting AOC Costières de Nîmes wines, the flavours of Nîme conquer gourmets and hearty eaters!

The morning continues with your guide who accmpanies your exploration of 'gourmet' centres during a trip in the historic heart of Nîmes. Between squares and fountains, the Arena and the Maison Carrée,the Musée de la Romanité and Carré d'Art, the visit is punctuated by stops in front of the appetizing windows of the emblematic shops of the city.

Lunch of regional specialities in the centre of the city.

Afternoon

The afternoon is devoted to **private mansions**. See the showcase façades of the mansions in the historic centre. By virtue of exclusive to private courtyards, enter by doors generally closed to the public. Be charmed by the rich decoration and by monumental staircases that reveal the art of living and building in Nîmes from the 16th to the 18th century.





Day 2: Uzès - Pont du Gard

Morning

Departure for **Uzès**, a Town of Art and History more than 2000 years old, accompanied by your guide. Its historical monuments, the famous Place aux Herbes, its Renaissance architecture and private mansions reveal the glorious past that made it the 1st Duchy of France.

12.30 lunch opposite the Roman monument

Afternoon

Go to the top of the **Pont du Gard** and admire the landscape!

To fully appreciate the richness and majesty of the monument, a witness to the genius of a civilisation, take the time for a guided visit to the third floor of the aqueduct. You will be able to see the canal that carried water at the time of the Romans.



Free time to profit from the museographic site. This interpretation centre is the largest in France and makes it possible to learn in a playful manner all the Romans' engineering skills and ingeniosity thanks to models, scale reconstitutions, etc.

Return to Nîmes with a stop at an oil mill.

How can you recognise a good olive oil? The owner/producer with tell you about his know-how: from growing the trees to producing high-quality oil by way of manufacturing methods that respect the fruits Without forgetting a visit to the mill, the olive grove and the shop!!



Day 3: Beaucaire -Bellegarde

Morning

Departure for **Beaucaire** and, more precisely, **Mas des Tourelles**, a very original experimental archeology initiative: the reconstitution at the real scale of an operational Gallo-Roman winery to make wine using the ancient method. Reception, visit of the installations and then the tasting, of three wines with original flavours.

Lunch in one of the rooms at the site

Afternoon

Departure for **Bellegarde** and **Mas de Provence**, an authentic farm, to learn about the organic growing of perfumed plants, their processing, their transformation into essential oils and finally the creation of organically certified perfumes.

All the senses are used during the guided visit—a unique and authentic experience.



The truffles of Uzès

Meeting with Michel Tournayre, truffle grower and President of the French and European Truffle Federation. He welcomes you to a 15-hectare oasis devoted to truffles, 'Les Truffières d'Uzès'. A moment for friendliness and sharing centred on this jewel of French gastronomy.







Departure for a wine-growing estate in the **Costières de Nîmes** wine-growing area.

In the South of the Rhône Valley, the vineyard receives the influence of the Rhone and the Mediterranean.

Its official organic farming certification in 2014 and the biodynamic management of the whole estate have enhanced the production of wines with character.

You go through vineyards, garrigue, and orchards using the signs marking the route that recount the history of the wines in relation with the territory: geology, fauna and flora, architecture, history and archaeology (archaeological digs investigating the Roman period).

Finish the morning with flavours by tasting—in the shade or in the vineyard—the richness of Provencal cuisine: try brandade de Nîmes, anchoïade and tapenade and delicious products—bull terrine with olives, goat cheese, olive oil and fruits from the farm

according to the season.

Afternoon

The visit of the winery and wine tasting continue this atmosphere of exchange until the return to Nîmes at the end of the day.

Return to Nîmes for dinner and accommodation.

Abbaye de Saint-Roman

Leave for a magic walk and see the incredible Abbaye de Saint-Roman! Magic tricks, stories, the discovery of edible plants and a visit of the Abbey (from May onwards).





Exploration of **Nîmes and its historical centre** that is so rich in heritage and anecdotes!

The everyday life of the city is still marked by its heritage. The décors, colonnades or arches borrowed from Roman architecture, the layouts and urban landscapes designed according to the perfectly conserved monuments make Nîmes a city of exceptional character.

Lunch in the city centre with wine to match the food.

Afternoon


Trip to **Aigues-Mortes** to taste *vins des Sables* at the *Domaine Royal de Jarras*. This vineyard rooted in sand was planted on an island that used to be called Isle de Stel, charged with history and inhabited by the murmurs of the knights that followed Louis IX in the Crusades.




Comfortably installed in a little train, explore the most unusual parts of the estate.

And then taste local products at the estate.

Exploration of the **Jardins de la Fontaine**, a substantial area of greenery laid out in the XVIIIth century by Jacques Philippe Maréchal, a fortifications engineer, around the sacred spring dedicated to Nemausus and the origin of the town.

Named 'A remarkable garden' by the Ministry of Culture, it is above all a treasure of refinement and quiet in the heart of the city.

The **Temple de Diane**, whose precise function is not known, is in the lower part. It is both the most romantic and also the most enigmatic monument in Nîmes and certainly associated with the **imperial sanctuary** called the *Augusteum*.

At the top of the gardens, the **Tour Magne** is the only tower left of the Augustean ramparts. It stands at the highest point of the city and gives courageous visitors an exceptional view of Nîmes.

Your guide will then take you to the **castellum**, the point of arrival of water from the Nîmes aqueduct that carried water from Fontaine d'Eure near Uzès to Nîmes.

The castellum is a very rare vestige as only two are left in the world!

Lunch (consisting of local products) in the heart of the Jardins de la Fontaine.

Afternoon

Departure for **Uzès**, an episcopal and ducal town, and its charming **medieval garden**.

A guided exploration of the plants that have accompanied humans during history: medicinal and food plants but also domestic and industrial dyes.

At the end of the visit, you can climb the **Tour du Roi** (100 steps) to see the view and also the former cells, the chapel, the first floor of the bishop's tower and exhibition rooms.

An infusion will be offered at the end of the visit.

Return to Nîmes for dinner and accommodation.

Morning

Departure to north of Nîmes in the direction of the Cévennes for an exotic day with heights.

Visit to the **Bambouseraie de Prafrance**, one of the finest gardens in France, for a moment of complicity with nature. This unique and singular botanical garden shows more than 1000 varieties of bamboos, rare flowers and remarkable trees and plants—making a magical and totally unexpected parenthesis in this part of the Cévennes.

You will then travel in time and explore breathtaking landscapes as a passenger on the **small Cévennes steam train.**

You end the day by visiting the former spinning factory **La Maison Rouge**, now a museum. A host of objects, tools, pottery and various utensils are shown off by the furniture and lighting. The scenography gives structure to the rooms and metamorphoses the collections to show everyday rural life in the Cévennes in the last century.

Return to Nîmes for dinner and accommodation.

The immense richness of the Bambouseraie makes it the fourth largest arboretum in France.

The Bambouseraie gained the status of 'Remarkable gardens' in 2005 and was entered on the Supplementary List of Historical Monuments in 2008.

For several years—like other contemporary gardens—it has housed more or less perennial or ephemeral installations by artists.

Bamboos grow at a great speed! Gaining 5 to 20 cm per day, bamboo is the fastest plant in the world!



Day 3

Morning

Departure for **Aigues-Mortes**, a fortified town built in the Middle Ages by Louis IX, who wanted the Kingdom of France to have a port on the Mediterranean.

A walk on the medieval ramparts around the town and especially the famous **Tour de Constance**, which become a symbol of resistance for Protestants all over the world.

Free time in the town.

Lunch in the heart of the town

Afternoon

Board the Little Train for a trip lasting for more than an hour in the heart of the **Salin d'Aigues-Mortes**. Discover the salt tables, the fantastic Camargue salt and the pink water that makes the place magical and exceptional. The work of the salt workers, the *gardians* of this intact and wild natural area, will hold no secrets for you! You will certainly see the famous flamingoes in this protected reserve and the algae that give them their so delicate pink colour.

The day finished, with a cruise on an authentic boat on the **canal from Rhône** to see the traditions of the Camargue: the marshes, rice farms and reed beds and the fauna and flora explained by the boatman. A stop in a bull farm is planned to see the work of breeders of *Camargue* horses and bulls, of the gardians and Camargue traditions.






